Dear Honourable Members of the European Parliament,

Thank you for your letter of 24 November 2021 and for the Joint Declaration in Solidarity with Memorial, signed by over sixty Members of the European Parliament.

The move to liquidate International Historical Educational Charitable and Human Rights Society Memorial and the Memorial Human Rights Centre is yet another case of using Russia's so-called "foreign agents" law to further shrink the space for independent activism and to curtail historical scholarship and critical debates. The EU deplores the Russian General Prosecutor's decision to demand the liquidation of Memorial and continues to condemn the Russian legislation on "foreign agents" which runs counter to Russia's international human rights obligations and commitments. The EU has called upon Russian authorities to reverse legal steps against Memorial and stop the crackdown on civil society and independent media.

On 22 November, Ambassadors of the EU Member States in Russia met with representatives of Memorial. The meeting was organised in light of the court hearings related to a decision to request liquidation of both organisations. Participants of the meeting reiterated their solidarity with and support to Memorial and in these challenging circumstances. Subsequently, on 25 November many diplomats observed the first hearing on substance in the case regarding liquidation of Memorial International.

Memorial is an internationally respected NGO and one of the oldest in Russia. Its activities remain central to the defence of human rights and serve as a bulwark against attempts to manipulate the historical memory of political repression. Its dismantling would be an irreplaceable loss.

It is extremely concerning that Russian authorities continue to restrict the work of independent civil society organisations, human rights defenders, media platforms and journalists. We will continue calling on the Russian authorities to repeal existing legislation on "foreign agents" and not to proceed with further legislation that breaches its international commitments as well as to stop the unabated crackdown on civil society and independent media.
